





# In Memoriam -

## David Scarborough's Wake

Cadet Lt. Col. David Eugene Scarborough passed away on March 7th, 2013, in Bay St. Louis, Mississippi. David "Scrabbo" attended Florida Military School for four years graduating in 1965 with the position of Adjutant. Following his graduation he enlisted in the Marine Corps Reserve where he served for six months active duty terminating his term of service for medical reasons.

David spent nine years in Kodiak, Alaska learning the drywall trade and commercial painting. There were times when he would venture to North Carolina and become involved with NASCAR and several top drivers. He had a strong passion for this sport and it would eventually dominate his conversation. He was born in Fruitland Park, Florida where he lived with his Mother, Father and sister Joyce prior to attending FMS.

Florida Military School was a very important part of David's life and he dearly loved the corps and the cadet's that made up the battalions. When the reunions were first organized, and he was located, he was present at every function he could possibly make even though it meant traveling from Diamond Head, MS, to DeLand, FL. Cadet Lt. Harry Silvis commented at his funeral, "He was the best boss I ever had." Col. Scarborough took his commitment seriously and it was evident by his military bearing and conduct, he was a true officer. There were several former cadet's that made the trip to celebrate the life of our fallen friend; Cadet Jim Gibson and wife, Cadet E.J. Jones and wife, Cadet Richard King, Cadet Harry Silvis and Cadet Steve Nash and wife.

David spent a lot of time at my home in DeLand and was very close to my Mother, Father, brothers and sisters. I felt a special relationship with "Scrabbs" above and beyond the old Navy barracks of our school. In the FMS museum there is a beautiful portrait and his dress blue jacket on display, well worth the visit.
